## SURFACE PREPARATION:

| <b>New steel</b>   | Steel surface should ideally be abrasive blast cleaning to minimum Sa 2/5. The surface must be completely clean and dry prior to application. And its temperature must be above the dew point to avoid condensation.   |
| <b>Maintenance</b> | Remove oil and grease, etc. with suitable detergent. Remove salt and other contaminants by (high pressure) fresh water cleaning. Remove all rust and loose material by abrasive blasting or power tool cleaning. Dust off residues. Touch up to full film thickness. |

| Film thickness:                        | May be specified in another film thickness than indicated depending on purpose and area of use.<br>This will alter spreading rate and may influence drying time and recoating intervals. Normal range is 50-75 microns/ 2-3 mils. |
| Thinning:                              | The type and amount of thinner depend on application conditions, application method, temperature, ventilation, and substrate. Thinner 30012 is recommended in general.  |

**Maximum recoating interval in moderate atmosphere is 14 days.**

**A completely clean surface is mandatory to ensure intercoat adhesion, especially at long Recoating intervals. Any dirt, oil, and grease have to be removed, e.g. with suitable detergent.**  
**Salts to be removed by fresh water hosing. To check an adequate quality of the surface cleaning a test patch is recommended before actual recoating.**

## SAFETY:
